New generation insecticides and freshwater invertebrates

Tuesday 21 April, 7pm

We'll hear from Sam Macaulay who has recently completed his PhD at the University of Otago on the ecological effects of neonicotinoid insecticides on New Zealand's running freshwater ecosystems.

An update on the New Zealand Bird Atlas

Tuesday 19 May, 7pm

Mary Thompson and Bruce McKinlay from Birds NZ will introduce the project, talk about the findings so far, and explain how you can be involved. During the next five years the task is to carry out at least one bird survey each season within each major habitat in every 100 km square grid over the whole of NZ. Anyone who can identify birds can take part and record observations via the eBird Atlas online database. The data gathered will be used for conservation planning for decades to come.

FIELD TRIPS

The meeting point for all field trips is in the Botany Department carpark, on the corner of Great King and Union Streets at 9am (unless otherwise stated).

Rocklands Gorge

Sunday 8 March, 9am start

We will travel about an hour and a half from Dunedin to a carpark near the Old Dunstan Road and walk to a weir on the eastern edge of the Lammermoor Range (an hour's easy walk each way).

The weir is one of Dunedin's water supply sources, drawing from a catchment of around 3700ha of subalpine tussock grassland country, which fortunately escaped the 5000ha fire nearby.

In the gorge there are spectacular views, and a range of dryland and subalpine plants such as *Melicytus* and Corokia, some of which will be in berry.

Post-fire regeneration, Black Rock Scientific Reserve

Sunday 19 April, 9am start, weather permitting.

We will travel about an hour and 15 minutes from Dunedin to a locked gate on the Eldorado Track off Mahinerangi Road and walk to the old gold diggings beside Deep Stream on the eastern edge of the Lammerlaw Range (about two hour's walk each way), oberving regeneration in the tussock grassland.

This area was part of the 5000 ha block burnt by the "Middlemarch" fire (which is actually some considerable distance from Middlemarch).
