#### A Night of Star Gazing - New Plymouth Observatory

Meet: NP Observatory, Marsland Hill, New Plymouth

Bring: Warm clothing as there is no heating inside the observatory and it can be very cool using the outside telescopes. Water bottle.

The night will not be cancelled unless it is shocking weather. If it is too cloudy to use the telescopes everyone receives a voucher to come again on a public night.

There is ramped access to the building and a wheelchair-friendly outdoor telescope option.

#### Native Frog & Fish Expedition

Bring: Warm clothes, wet weather gear, torch (check

the batteries), cellphone or camera

Nathan Hills will help us look for native frogs and fish around the bowl and lake areas. Nathan is very experienced and has led expeditions in the park previously for KCC and the public.

Numbers are limited to 15 ppl max on each night. A registration form will be sent out. Get your registration in quick for this one.

This activity goes ahead regardless of weather. The frogs and fish love the rain. Note: No dogs or other pets allowed in the park.

#### Visit to "The Junction" Zero Waste Hub

The Junction Zero Waste Hub is where the contents of your household recycling bins are separated and bailed, ready to be transported off site into new goods.

Erin, the Recycling Tour Educator will talk to us, along with interactive stations and you can even try your hand out at sorting on a conveyor.
