



Guidance for Submissions on Auckland Council Dog Policy By-Law & Access Rules Review. 20th January 2025- 23rd February 2025.

Big Manly & Tindalls Dotterel Minders Forest & Bird, Hibiscus Coast.







This guidance is to assist those wanting to see an increase in protection for New Zealand dotterels, tūturiwhatu, at Big Manly and Tindalls Beaches through amendments to the Auckland Council Dog Policy, By-Law and Access rules.

The new option outlined in the guidance below is what we recommend you copy and paste word for word. This will demonstrate to Auckland Council that a large number of community members are supporting this option. Following discussions to work out a mutually acceptable solution, (which is different to that currently suggested by Auckland Council), Dog Friends Auckland and Rodney are sharing the same proposed option.

#### **Current Policy rules**

A **time and season rule** on Big Manly Beach from headland to headland prohibits dogs between 10am and 5pm, 1 December to 1 March (dogs allowed under control off a leash on the beach at all other times) (Schedule 2).

#### Proposed amended Policy rules

Apply current **time and season rule** to Big Manly Beach from the western headland to Cross Street (Schedule 2).

Dogs allowed **under control on a leash** at all times from Cross Street to the eastern headland connecting to Tindalls Beach (Schedule 1(4)(a)).

B. If you do not support the proposed change, would you support one of the alternative options presented to decision-makers in December 2024? #### THIS IS THE MOST IMPORTANT PART

As dotterels do not always nest in the same part of the beach, this option does not sufficiently reduce risk to the dotterels. It does not prevent people from getting too close to nests causing the birds to be flushed off and leaving eggs vulnerable to predation and the elements. It also does not prevent people walking their dogs directly up to a nest. The year round option in particular causes conflict with many dog owners.

The alternative option I support, agreed by Hibiscus Coast Forest & Bird and Dog Friends Auckland is:

- The current time and season rule (a total ban of dogs on the beaches between 10.00am and 17.00pm from December 1st to March 1st) should remain.

**During bird nesting season 1st September – 31st March:** 

- Dogs must be on a lead at all times within a zone of
   200m around a marked dotterel nest.
- Dogs are prohibited from entering the 50m cordoned off zone around the nest itself.

Repeat the same steps for Tindalls Beach which will appear next.



## Are there any dog access rules at other local parks and beaches in Auckland that you think council should change?


Your feedback on this section will inform any future review of dog access rules. A future review has not been scheduled at this time and no changes will be made on any location you identify in this section as part of this proposal.
